Dear Members

It is with great sadness that I take over writing this newsletter following the deaths in the last few months of Michael Horsburgh.who, as you probably know, died in November last year after a short illness and Michael Bealing who died in July. As a result of Michael Horsburgh's illness the usual autumn newsletter and raffle did not happen. In 1986 Michael formed the Friends of the DDF, which has really been the work horse for fund raising. He and Jean worked hard to raise the profile of our charity and after her death in 2006 he remained extremely committed to the task even in his 90th year. Over the last 30 years the DDF has raised nearly half a million pounds which has transformed the work of the gastroenterology department by supporting research, the purchase of equipment and other activities. Some innovations which have resulted from this work have improved patient care not just in Suffolk but across the globe.

Michael Bealing was a founder member of the DDF who was recruited by Professor Duncan Bell in 1984 to help to set up a charity to support research and improve care of patients with digestive disorders. Michael brought with him a wealth of business skills and contacts complemented by a wonderful ability to engage with everyone he came in contact with. Under his leadership the DDF was guided forward and he was often able to assist us to see 'the wood for the trees' when faced with financial and management tasks.

I have taken over as chairman and the committee have decided to restructure by amalgamating the Friends of the DDF with the main committee. We have been pleased to welcome new members who are keen to reinvigorate the fund raising activities of the Charity but need more support.

During the last year street collections in Felixstowe and Woodbridge raised £410 which was only possible thanks to the hard work of Humphry Adair and his group of dedicated collectors.

Fibro scanner for Ipswich

At the recent Annual General Meeting, Dr Abdul Mohsen consultant gastroenterologist, reported on how the 'Fibro Scanner' which DDF purchased in 2013 had been put to good use. The scanner is a non invasive ultrasound based technique which assesses scarring of the liver in patients with suspected liver disease especially those with chronic hepatitis and reduces the need for an invasive liver biopsy. Ipswich is one of only a few district hospital with this technology. We heard how it is proposed to extend its use to other hospitals locally and to assess inmates of a local prison where chronic hepatitis is a not uncommon problem. The scanner has revolutionised the work of the team and this work is likely form part of a research publication.

We also heard that the collaborative study, which the DDF are supporting, between the Ipswich Hospital and Dr Will Thomas of the University of Suffolk examining the experiences of patients with inflammatory bowel disease is progressing and more news will be forthcoming in a future newsletter.
